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





Victoria Peak



From The Peak's summit, visitors can gaze down on the jungle of skyscrapers and the Victoria Harbour, where ferries and pleasure junks glide by. At night, the whole area becomes a dazzling spectacle of lights.



Repulse Bay is one of the most accessible and picturesque beaches on the south side of Hong Kong Island.

Stanley Market



Stanley Market is a delight for shoppers, filled with stalls, shops and innovative restaurants.

Sightseeing in Macau

Macau Tower



Soaring 338 metres above the city, the Macau Tower is the 10th highest freestanding tower in the world and the 8th tallest in Asia.

Restaurante Fernando



Fernando, which is located on Hac Sa Beach on Coloane's southern coast, is widely popular for a stripped-down recipe of bare brick walls, stone floors and mountains of food. the cooking is excellent and the atmosphere irresistible.

Ruins of St. Paul



The surviving facade rises in 4 colonnaded tiers, and is covered with carvings and statues which eloquently illustrate the early days of the Church in Asia.

The Museum of Macau



The Museum of Macau aims to preserve the cultural traditions, usages and habits, which specifically belong to Macau, in a place where East and West have so peculiarly learnt how to meet and to live side by side along the centuries.

5. BRIEF INFORMATION ON HONG KONG

Population & Languages

More than 6.7 million people live in Hong Kong. Almost 96 per cent of the population are Chinese. The official languages are Chinese and English, with Cantonese the most widely spoken Chinese dialect. Use of Putonghua is growing.

Weather

Spring (March to mid-May)

Temperature and humidity rise gradually in spring. Evenings can be cool but lightweight jackets will suffice. The average temerature ranges from 18°C - 27°C (64°F - 80°F), humidity about 82 per cent.

Getting around



The underground Mass Transit Railway (MTR) system (Route map at Annex I), numerous bus routes, a network of railway - Kowloon Canton Railway (KCR) and Light Rail (LR), trams and ferries, and taxis ensure that getting around town is quick, comfortable and easy.

Banks

Major banks are open from 9am to 4:30pm Monday to Friday, and 9am to 12:30pm on Saturday.


5. BRIEF INFORMATION ON HONG KONG

Shops and Offices



The vast majority of shops are open every day from 10:00am - 7:00pm. Exceptions are stores in busy retail areas like Causeway Bay (Map of Causeway Bay at Annex II) and Tsim Sha Tsui which stay open even later, perhaps until 9:30pm or later. Those in Central, usually close their doors by 7:00pm. Office hours are weekdays 9:00am - 5:00pm, and Saturdays 9:00am - 1:00pm.


Favourite Foods



Hong Kong is the capital of Chinese cuisine. Cantonese, the local style, is known for its fresh flavours and quick frying. Steamed fish and barbecued meats are popular dishes. Dim sum - or light snacks - is another quintessential Hong Kong dining experience. Har gau (shrimp dumplings)and shiu mai (minced pork and shrimp in flour casing) belong to such tasty snacks. You can also savour the most succulent Peking duck served with spring onions and plum sauce on wafer-thin pancakes, or spicy Szechuanese or Hunanese fare.

Tipping

Most restaurants will levy a 10 per cent service charge but waiters, bellboys, porters, restroom attendants and taxi drivers will happily accept loose change.


MTR Route Map / MTR (Le système de masse souterrain) Carte d'Itinéraire / MTR (Das Bahn) Wegdiagramm

Causeway Map / Causeway Bay carte / Causeway Bay Wegdiagramm







The Chinese Lion is a mythological creature that represents strength, wisdom, good luck, and has the ability to drive away evil spirits, e.g. the legendary monster from the mountains on the first day of the lunar year and destroy villages and crops before returning to its lair. 'Eye dotting' at the start of any major undertaking symbolizes the birth of new vision; and 'Green picking' the acquisition of good luck and prosperity.

Le lion chinois est une créature mythologique qui représente la force, sagesse, bonne chance, et a la capacité de conduire les spiritueux mauvais partis, par exemple le monstre légendaire des montagnes le premier jour de l'année lunaire et de détruire des villages et des récoltes avant le renvoi à sa tanière. "pointillage d'oeil" au début de l'entreprise principale symbolise la naissance de la nouvelle vision ; et "Green la cueillette", l'acquisition de la bonnes chance et prospérité.

Der chinesische Löwe ist ein mythologisches Geschöpf, das Stärke, Klugheit, gutes Glück darstellt und die Fähigkeit hat, weg schlechten Geist, z.B. das legendäre Monster zu fahren von den Bergen am ersten Tag des Mondjahres und Dörfer und Getreide zu zerstören, bevor es zu seinem Lager zurückgeht.
